COVID-19 Prevention Plan	Units are required to review <u>University COVID-19 Health and Safety Plan</u> with personnel upon hire as part of their Accident Prevention Plan/new employee orientation.	<u>University COVID-19 Health</u> <u>and Safety Plan</u>
COVID-19 training	Required for personnel: Initial training is required, annual training is recommended.	COVID-19 Safety Training
Face coverings	 High-quality face masks are required to be worn in all UW patient care settings, including clinical research settings, dental clinics, and UW shuttles serving healthcare facilities. The masking requirements in UW healthcare facilities are based on respiratory virus transmission (COVID-19, flu, and RSV) metrics. Follow the mask signs posted upon entry to clinics. Face coverings are strongly recommended indoors when returning to campus after ending COVID-19 isolation and after a higher risk COVID-19 exposure. Mask indoors when around others until 10 days have passed from the start of illness or until 10 days have passed from when you were exposed. Otherwise, face coverings are optional, and may be considered for those at high risk for severe illness. 	UW Face Covering Website
Isolation	Stay home and away from others after testing positive or while experiencing <u>symptoms</u> . Follow the <u>flowchart</u> instructions if you have symptoms, exposure or test positive.	Public Health Flowchart Case & Exposure Guidance
Reporting a positive test result	 Reporting positive test results to EH&S is not required in most cases. UW personnel who suspect they were infected with COVID-19 while at work are asked to submit an OARS report. Supervisors who suspect an outbreak of COVID-19 in their workforce (>10% out sick) are asked to contact EH&S via covidehc@uw.edu. 	Public Health Flowchart
Symptom monitoring	Self-monitoring for <u>symptoms</u> required daily (no reporting); stay home, do not come to work or class, and follow instructions on <u>flowchart</u> if you experience symptoms.	Public Health Flowchart
Testing	 Test if <u>symptoms</u> develop and after an exposure. Test when you are asked to get tested by the University, the local health department, or your healthcare provider 	Rapid antigen <u>COVID-19</u> <u>tests</u> (no cost) are available on campus.
Vaccination	Being <u>up-to-date</u> on COVID-19 vaccination is strongly encouraged for all UW personnel and students. <i>UW Medicine medical facility personnel and students in Health Sciences Immunization Program follow their respective COVID-19 vaccination policies.</i>	UW COVID-19 Vaccine Resources
